The Fasting Person Who Eats or Drinks Due to Forgetfulness

On the authority of Abu Hurairah (Radiya-Ilahu 'an-hu) that the Prophet (Salla-Ilahu alayhi wa sallam) said: Whoever **forgot** that he is fasting, and then **eats** or **drinks**, must complete his fast. This is because it is Allah Who has fed him and given him drink [i.e. it is Allah Who *decreed* this to happen]. [al-Bukhaaree, no. 1933]

Rulings Derived from this Hadeeth

1. The correctness (*Sihhah*) of the **fast** of the person who **ate** or **drank** or had *sexual relations* (with one's spouse) *forgetfully*.

[al-Hasan and Mujaahid (Rahima-humAllah) said: If one has sexual intercourse forgetfully (with one's spouse), there is no blame upon him. (al-Bukhaaree, chapter 26, Book of Fasting, Under the Title-Heading: If a fasting person ate or drank forgetfully)].

[al-Haafith ibn Hajar mentioned here: Ibn Juraij asked 'Ataa about a man who has sexual relations with his wife forgetfully in Ramadaan? Ataa said: [Such a thing] is not forgotten. This requires al-Qadaa' (to make up the fast for that day). Those who followed 'Ataa in this (opinion) are al-Awzaa'ee, al-Laith, Maalik and Ahmad, and it is one of the two opinions of the Shaafi'ee Madh-hab (School of Law). And all of them differentiated between eating (al-Akl) and having sexual relations (al-Jimaa') (forgetfully). The well-known opinion of Ahmad is that it is also obligatory upon such a person to fulfill the Kaffaarah (freeing a slave, or fasting two consecutive months or feeding sixty poor people). See: 'Fath al-Baaree', 4/659-660]

2. There is no sin (*Ithm*) against him due to his eating or drinking, since it is *not by choice* [i.e. he did it due to *forgetfulness* - not *consciously* choosing to do so *knowing* that he is fasting].

[This is in accord with the saying of Allah: 'Allah does not burden any person beyond his ability (al-Wus'u). He gets the reward for that (good) which he has earned, and he is punished for that (evil) which he has earned. O our Lord, Punish us not if we forget or fall into error...' al-Baqarah, 2:286. In the Hadeeth of Abu Hurairah (Radiya-llahu'an-hu), the Prophet (Salla-llahu alayhi wa Sallam) said: 'Allah said: Yes! (I accept your supplication)'. [Reported by Muslim] And in the Hadeeth of Ibn `Abbaas (Radiya-llahu 'an-humaa), the Prophet (Salla-llahu alayhi wa Sallam) said: 'Allah said: I have done it (i.e. I have already accepted your supplication)'. [Reported by Muslim]

[Also, the Hadeeth of the Prophet (Salla-Ilahu alayhi wa Sallam): 'Verily, Allah has pardoned – for methe **mistakes** of my Ummah, their **forgetfulness** and that which they are **compelled** to do'. At-Tabaraanee, Ibn Hibbaan, Saheeh Ibn Maajah, 2/178, no. 1675/2073 and 1677/2075]

3. The meaning of 'Allah has fed him and given him drink' - is that this action happened without a conscious choice. Rather, it is Allah Who has **decreed** this to happen to him, by causing him to forget that he is fasting.
