## Making A Regular Habit of Giving Lectures During The Taraaweeh Prayers Imaam Muhammad Naasirud-Deen al-Albaanee (Rahimahullaah)

## Question:

Is it permissible for the Imaam of a masjid to deliver a **Maw'idhah** (religious exhortation, reminder or word of advice) during **Salaat at-Taraawee** (the voluntary night prayers of **Ramadaan**)?

## **Answer:**

The answer is that it is Yajooz wa Laa Yajooz (permissible and not permissible).

If the *Tan-beeh* (admonition, advice or remark) and *Tah-theer* (warning), the *Amr* (command) and *Nahy* (prohibition) were for some passing matter (i.e. something that happened at the moment, unplanned) – this is an obligatory (Waajib) matter.

However, if he (i.e. the Imaam) does this on a *regular basis* (*Nithaaman*), *habitually* ('Aadatan) – **this is contrary to the Sunnah** (*Khilaaf as-Sunnah*). [Silsilah al-Hudaa wan-Noor, Tape no. 656]

## Shaykh Muhammad Naasirud-Deen al-Albaanee (rahimahullaah) also said:

Qiyaamu Ramadaan (The prayer of standing in Ramadaan) has only been legislated for the purpose of Ziyaadatu-t-Taqarrub (an increase in getting near) to Allaah, the Mighty and Majestic, by way of Salaatul-Qiyaam (i.e. Taraaweeh).

For this reason, we – personally - do not agree to mixing *Salaatu-t-Taraaweeh* (the voluntary night prayers of Ramadaan) with any form of '*Ilm* (knowledge) and *at-Ta'aleem* (teaching) and the like of it.

Rather, it is befitting (or more proper) that *Salaatul-Qiyaam* (i.e. *Taraaweeh*) be an act of pure unmixed worship (*Mahd al-Ibaadah*).

As for *al-'Ilm* (knowledge, i.e. teaching and learning) – it has its time; it is not limited to a specific time. Rather, what should be considered concerning it [i.e. when it is appropriate to teach] is the benefit of the students.

This is the original rule, and I mean by this that whoever takes this as a **habit**, i.e. teaching the people after every four Raka'aat for example, during Salaatul-Qiyaam (Night Prayers in Ramadaan) - taking this as a **habit** ('Aadah) — **this is** Muh-da-thah (a newly invented act) Mu-kha-li-fah lis-Sunnah (contrary to the Sunnah).
